**Rajeev Dhavan** – A Senior Advocate of the Indian Supreme Court; and former Commissioner of the International Commission of Jurists of which he is now Hon. Member and called to the Allahabad Bar and Middle Temple.

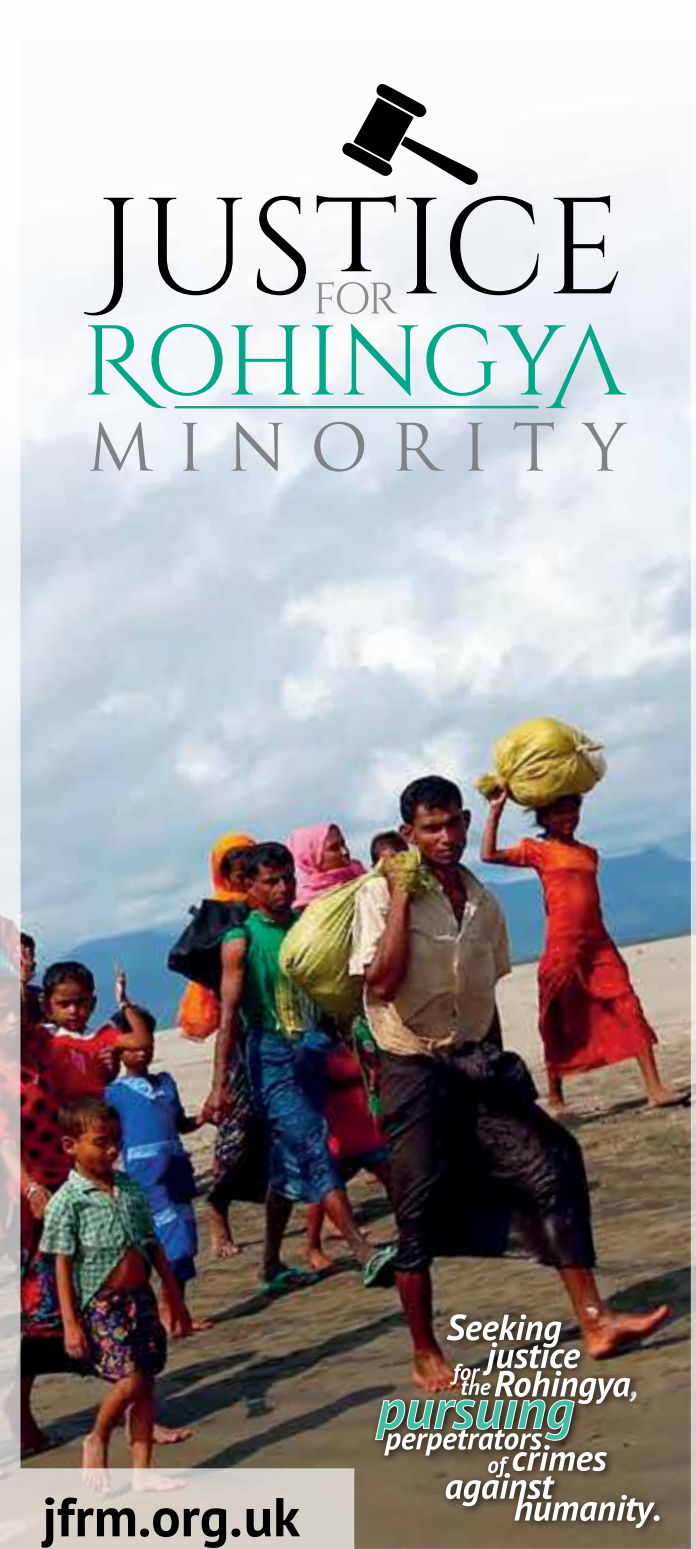
